BRIAN YOUNG HIGHLIGHTS NLSW

Creationist speaker Brian Young was the highlight of National Lutheran Schools Week at Faribault Lutheran School. He captivated audiences with both of his presentations. On Wednesday morning he presented *Amazing Animals* to the student bodies of Faribault Lutheran School and Canon Valley Lutheran High School, grades six through eight from Trinity Lutheran School in Janesville, as well as a sprinkling of adults.

In this presentation he talked about the many “adaptations” that animals have that make them unique and help them to survive. He then shared that evolutionists believe and teach that these adaptations evolved over a period of millions of years. He challenged the audience to think about how the animals survived during those millions of years during which they didn’t have that adaptation if it is indeed necessary for survival today. The conclusion is that God created both us and the entire world in a magnificent way.

The evening presentation fascinated an audience of about 300 as he talked about *The Pre-Flood World*. He answered a lot of questions that many people have regarding dating methods, reconstruction of bones found, and many other topics. He gave those present a lot of information for talking points as they encounter people who adhere to the “millions of years” theory.

Other events during the week were all-campus devotions early in the week led by Pastors Kinne and Mundahl respectively, participation in the Brain Bowl hosted by Canon Valley Lutheran High School (we also won that), all students visiting a care facility in the community, and a very well attended Grandparents’ Day on Friday.

FLS TECHNOLOGY ADVANCES

The overall technology picture for Faribault Lutheran School has taken a big step forward with the installation of ceiling mounted projectors in all the north cam-

pus classrooms. The south campus has one projector and computer on a mobile cart that can be moved among the rooms.

The projectors, which are each connected to a computer, will make it possible for each teacher to make customized presentations to their class, as well as access the internet for class work. All of this will be viewable by the entire class on a wall mounted screen.

PRINCIPAL SEARCH CONTINUES

The call committee for the Board of Directors has interviewed three potential candidates for the position of principal for Faribault Lutheran School and is soon set to select one and issue a call. The three candidates are currently serving in Lutheran schools in Fort Smith, AR; Farrar, MO; and St. Paul, MN.

ENROLLMENT CONTINUES

The enrollment process for the 2010-2011 school year has begun and continues to be open. Enrollment applications are coming in slowly at this point, but the Board of Directors feel that we are on target to at least maintain enrollment for next year. Any application for tuition assistance needs to be submitted by **April 15**.
