Video Mission headed up by Larry and Vivian Hagre. We are anxiously waiting to hear their report when they return. The students gathered \$257.41 to support this cause.

In addition to all of this, the south campus (grades K-2 and Peace Preschool) gathered funds in support of the Peace Lutheran Church food shelf. They gathered a total of \$700 which was supplemented by a gift from Wal Mart in the amount of \$1,000. These donations helped stock the shelves as well as put together "care packages" which included household and toiletry items which were also given out by the Peace food shelf.

CALL PROCESS CONTINUES

The process of identifying and calling a new principal is progressing. A list of names has been received from the Minnesota South district office. A committee appointed by the Board of Directors gleaned through those names and sifted out the top five names of those who seemed to fit our needs. They were contacted and given the opportunity to indicate their willingness to continue to be considered. That narrowed the list to two and one has been added since.

The next step is to conduct telephone interviews which will result in a further ranking. The final step before the call is to hopefully conduct an on-site visit by the top choice. It is still the plan to extend a call so that a decision can be made by the principal-elect by about mid-March.
