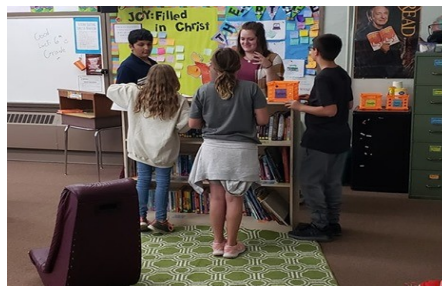


Electives are Underway
