old. Glitter. Glitz. All those things and more make an appearance at the annual FLS Gala.

This evening of elegance started in 2019, with sisters and parents of FLS students, Jen Becker and Kristina Rauenhorst at the helm of this annual fundraising event.

"We decided to co-chair the event as it is a lot of work for one person. We didn't know how many volunteers we would end up with so felt working together was best," says Becker.

The FLS Gala features a silent and live auction, appetizers, dinner, and cocktails for attendees. The idea for the Gala originally came from when the now closed, Cannon Valley Lutheran High School

used to host their annual fundraising evening.

"It provided the opportunity to focus on one large fundraising event versus having multiple smaller ones throughout the year," says Becker. "That way families didn't have to feel like they had to sell or deliver items."

The Gala is an important funding piece to larger, capital projects at FLS. All funds raised from the evening go to support capital projects at FLS that may not get done otherwise through normal dollars.

"Without the Gala, many of our large projects at the school would take years to get done," says Principal Chrysteena Saehler. "The donors from that evening help keep our school moving forward."

Former FLS principal Seth Winter was instrumental in getting the Gala off the ground as well. He had a hand in ensuring the Master of Ceremonies,

Joel Landskroener, Executive Director of Mayer Lutheran High School, made the evening entertaining for attendees.

"Seth Winter had heard about me from friends and relatives who had seen my emceeing work for our local school and civic clubs," says Landskroener. "I love to have fun and help our schools succeed in raising funds – being the MC enables me to do so."

The Gala has provided funds for an updated security system at the school and most recently, new curtains for the stage for all the FLS performances. Currently, funds are being held as seed money for a capital campaign for a complete gymnasium renovation for the school.

"The Gala raises a lot of funds for the school that otherwise wouldn't come in, but also brings together current and past families, members from our supporting congregations and community members who support the school and Christian education," says Becker.

"The improvements we have been able to make with Gala funds in security and with our performing arts area helped make the school a welcoming and safe space for our students and families," says Saehler.

Landskroener, like many of the attendees, is a large advocate for Christian education and understands the important role the Gala plays to providing a Christian education to students from Faribault and the surrounding communities.

"We need Jesus in our classrooms, gyms, theaters, and athletic fields. A truly well-rounded education must include scripture and the truths taught therein," says Landskroener. "Providing a Christian education for our kids is one of the most important things we could ever do for our children and the Church."

While the Gala continues to be a success with Becker and Raunhorst leading the charge, they have goals to get more families involved with attending but also volunteering. "It is a very rewarding to volunteer – it is a fun event to be a part of," Becker adds.

Volunteers have options with how they want to be a part of the Gala. They can serve by specialty or interest area on the committee, help with securing donations, or even just help with event preparation in the days leading up to the Gala.

"The Gala committee works hard to go out and find donors and make the event feel special - they spend months leading up to the event making sure every detail is taken care of," says Saehler. "I cannot thank them enough for their hard work and dedication and all they do for the kids and school."

"I always enjoy volunteering at the FLS Gala and always feel a warm welcome to this strange man from Mayer. Having so much support from FLS lifts my spirits and assures me that the students in Faribault are in good hands," Landskroener adds.

You can also support the PTO through monetary donations which help with events and staff appreciation opportunities," says Schlichter. "We are always trying to come up with fun new ideas – you don't need to commit large amounts of time – even just sitting in on a meeting or two to provide input so we ensure we are capturing as many ideas as possible."

With a new year full of events slated, the PTO is sure to continue to help FLS families, students and teachers feel they are part of the FLS community.

Faith in God's plan

Diana Kitzman has always had a passion for teaching and found her home at Faribault Lutheran School.

Kitzman, originally from south Minneapolis, attended Gustavus Adolphus College in St. Peter, earning her B.A. in Elementary Education. Her first teaching job was at Laurel Hall Lutheran School in North Hollywood, California.

"I taught at Trinity Lutheran School for two years before the consolidation of Trinity and Peace into Faribault Lutheran School," says Kitzman. "Although I wasn't officially a called teacher, I knew God called me to teach here. Shortly after I began teaching, I pursued my colloquy from Concordia St. Paul."





Kitzman has noted that her time at Faribault Lutheran School has been a strong anchor in the growth of her own faith and relationship with God.

"My faith, and the faith of my family has grown because of my involvement with our school, and I know that God's hand was directing that from the start. I will always be grateful that the Board of Education at Trinity at the time saw something that led them to choose me."

"Spending the last 27 years helping children grow spiritually, emotionally, socially and academically has been an honor that I would not have thought I was up for, but God did," says Kitzman. "I'm sure I've made mistakes in all those areas, but just pray that those students with which He trusted me, still know how much God loves them, and what Jesus did because of that love. Each of those children blessed me in some way, and I hope I was able to do the same for them."

Kitzman has been instrumental in the success of various reading programs and the book fair at FLS. She organizes the read-a-thon along with summer reading challenges for students.

"She wants kids to love to read and to explore through reading and her committment to the reading programs like the read-a-thon and summer reading program is truly amazing," says Principal Chrysteena Saehler. "She also ensures her students have devoted time in her classroom to reading and reads out loud to her students too."


The goals Kitzman have for her classroom and students each year are exemplified through her teaching, and the relationships she has created with past students. Her philosophy centers around focusing on the love Jesus has for her students, working in partnership with the students' parents, supporting and encouraging her students in faith along with their physical and emotional needs.



"I want to keep kids excited about learning and wanting to come to school, and much of the time that has nothing to do with academics," says Kitzman. "A child's social and emotional health has always been important to me, but it seems that now is more important than ever."

"Diana is a calm person by nature, but is very personable. She connects with others in a way that not many can do," says Saehler "She is the first to turn to prayer during good and hard times, and she shows this example to her students and the staff."

"I try to connect with each child every day and help each of them know that they are an important part of our classroom," says Kitzman. "I hope that children and families remember me as a teacher who loved them no matter what, and who always found reasons to like each of them as well."
